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



Jorja's Scholarship Journey

We always like to celebrate the success of our students—big things come out of little places!

One of our year 9 High School students, Jorja Rutherford, has recently been rewarded with a Rural Scholarship at Perth College for years 10,11 and 12. Jorja has lived in Pannawonica since she was 10 months old and has been a student at Pannawonica Primary School since Kindergarten in 2011. Jorja's parents, Clint and Stacy, have always been against sending their children away, as Stacy likes to say "keep her finger in the pulse" and Clint never wanted his daughter out of his sights. As Jorja has grown in confidence and blossomed over the years especially with her sport and swimming success, they realised there may be just a little more out there in the bigger world.

Whilst Jorja and her family were in Exmouth last July school holidays, Perth College girls school and some of their staff paid a visit to Exmouth offering a netball clinic to the girls in town with their specialised PE teachers, and some of their Year 12 girls who were boarding at PC that flew home to their families in Exmouth for the school holidays.

This is where they met the Boarding house staff and Enrolment staff too.

Jorja also attended a Perth College Foot ball clinic in Karratha (something else to do) where she met and joined in a skills clinic with AFL footy girls Dana Hooker and Courtney Guard.

As we got to know the visiting staff from Perth College a few questions were raised about the boarding opportunities on offer and that they had noticed Jorja's natural sporting skills, before we knew it, Jorja was flying to Perth to experience her first boarding house "sleepover experience" which was very daunting but she loved it, especially having her own room, meeting more girls her own age, the sport, the canteen, and all the weekend activities on offer. The cost involved with sending Jorja to Perth College was quite hefty and advised the school they might not be able to afford the fees. That very day, the scholarships opened up enabling Jorja to apply, she had 3 days to get the paper work in plus a 200 word essay on the word "Humility."

Jorja made it through to the next stage where she sat a 4 hour test with Mrs Jamieson covering Maths, English and Practical knowledge.

They then received a phone call from PC where Stacy and Jorja got to meet and greet with the Principal of Perth College via skype, who was a Carnarvon girl herself so very understanding on the North West lifestyle. There were plenty of nerves in the air wanting to make a good impressions and say the right thing.

The Principal was just lovely, throwing the appropriate questions Jorja's way to make her feel comfortable and just be herself. It was there and then the Principal tried to pass through the screen an envelope to which contained one of three, of the highest scholarships that Perth College offer. Jorja was picked out of 150 girls across WA by a panel of seven people. Jorja and Stacy couldn't believe it was actually happening, it wasn't something they ever set out to

achieve, it all just fell in to place, they just sat there and cried with utter shock and

excitement.

Now, the next journey begins for Jorja, building new friendships for life, challenging herself with new sports and utilising all the support to map out her future. It just goes to show, sometimes you just need that little opportunity for someone else to see what you don't, to give you a little push in a different direction.
