



PANNAWONICA PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWSLETTER

1 Day off a fortnight = 4 weeks off per year.


1 day per week = 8 weeks off per year.

2 days off per week = 16 weeks per year.

3 days off per week = 24 weeks per year.

I like helping others so no-one gets left behind and take care of other students.




Eve—Ashburton Faction Captain—
